





## Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month events help students make connections through hands-on learning

Wednesday, March 1, 2023- Students in schools across Canada will participate in annual Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month (CALM) events hosted by Agriculture in the Classroom-Canada (AITC-Canada) for the entire month of March.

CALM is a hands-on program that encourages children to learn about and celebrate agriculture. Agriculture in the Classroom NL (AITC-NL) is celebrating its 12<sup>th</sup> annual CALM in 2023. Following the theme "Our Food, Our Story," AITC-NL will deliver this program in Kindergarten to Grade 12 classrooms across Newfoundland and Labrador, sharing stories of farmers and agriculture professionals through presentations, classroom visits, virtual farm tours and other resources. Topics raised during CALM ignite discussion about food security, safety, and production.

This year, AITC-NL will launch an animated storybook, "Reggie's Technology Adventure," following Reggie as he learns about modern technology used in agriculture today. AITC-NL will also launch a new activity book – "Plant, Grow, Eat, Share" – which pairs with the storybook







released in March 2022. Along with these new resources, audio storybooks are available on AITC-NLs website, along with other resources for teachers and students.

Throughout the month of March, AITC-NL is partnering with the Newfoundland and Labrador Beekeeping Association (NLBKA) and Egg Farmers of Newfoundland and Labrador (EFNL) to host the "Bee Creative Literacy Contest" for Kindergarten to Grade 6 students. Classes can submit up to three of their top literary works that combine the students' literacy talent with their knowledge of agriculture in Newfoundland and Labrador. The winning classes get to decorate the beehive any way they choose. The beehive will be returned to the participating beekeeper's farm to be taken care of in the name of the school/class.

All contest entries can be submitted by tagging @AITCNL and @NLBees1 via Twitter with the hashtag #BeeCreative23. All entries must be submitted by April 2, 2023. The contest runs March 1-31, 2023, with winners announced Tuesday, April 4, 2023.

CALM activities are funded in part by the Canadian Agricultural Partnership, a five-year (2018-2023), \$3-billion investment by federal, provincial and territorial governments to innovate, strengthen and grow Canada's agriculture and agri-foods sector. This includes a \$2-billion commitment that is cost-shared 60% federally and 40% provincially/territorially for programs that are designed and delivered by provinces and territories.
